New Bus Route

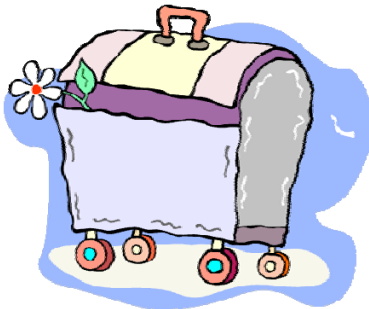

REPAIR WORK STARTS ON THE RIVERSIDE LOCK-UP AND THE STAGE
